FUN FACTS

The Montessori method arises from Dr. Montessori's discovery of what she referred to as "the child's true normal nature". According to the Montessori method, when we give freedom to children in an environment prepared with materials designed for their self-directed learning activity, it sustains and supports their true natural way of being. It is an approach to educating children based on scientific research and experiences

The teacher's role is very different than a traditional school; in this method, the teacher observes the children occupied in activities that follow their own natural interests. This indirect teaching controls the environment, not the child. The teacher's role includes experimental interactions with children, referred to as "lessons". This method is mainly practical with young children, between the ages of 18 months to 6 years


